Try to make a routine at least once a year of rereading your jurisdiction's Code of Judicial Conduct to remind yourself of the rules. If you haven't already done so, download it onto your computer and bookmark it in your browser along with the conduct commission and advisory committee web sites in your state. If your jurisdiction issues judicial ethics advisory opinions, you should also get in the habit of consulting that site.
